

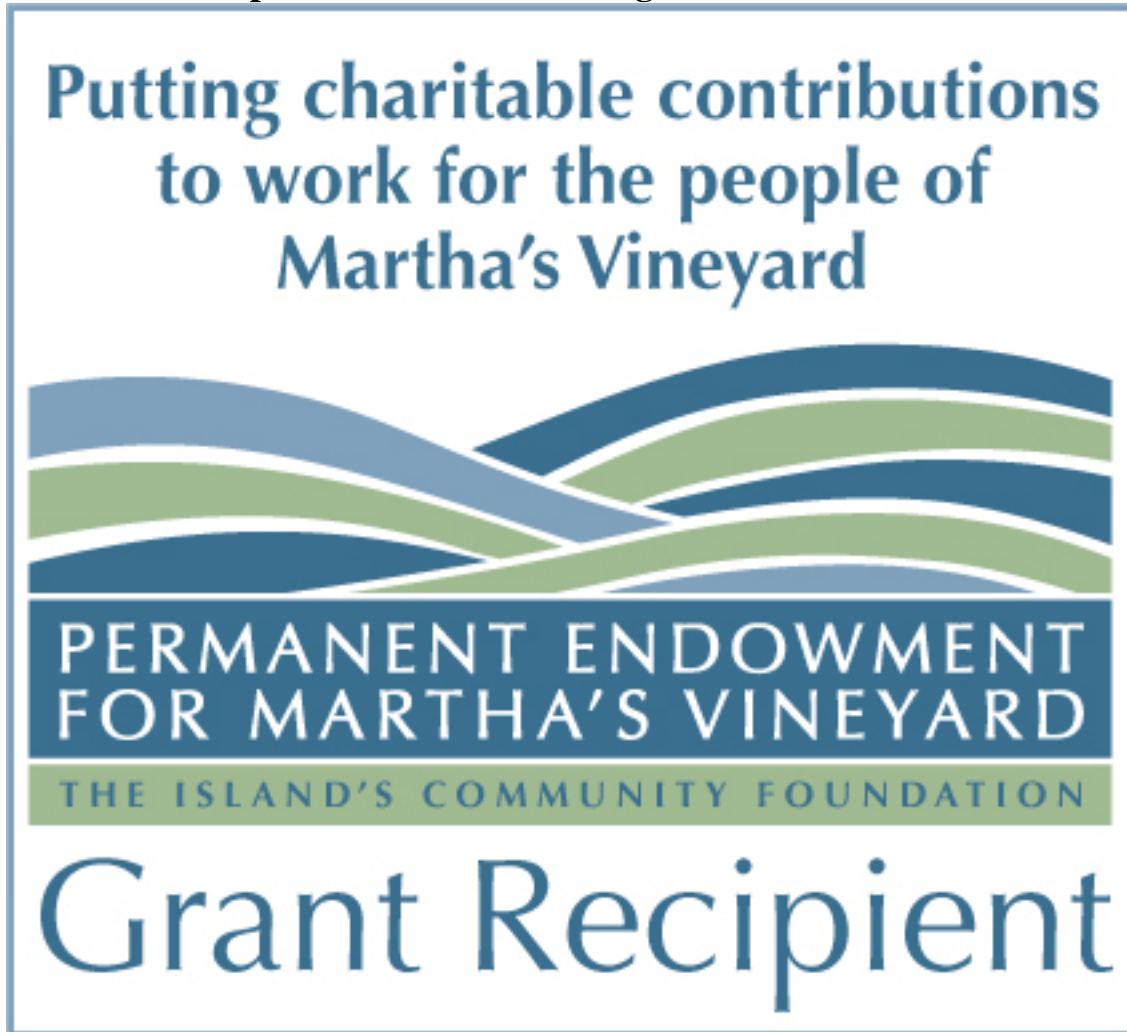
Week 1: June 30th: Creativity, Locally grown and Sustainability:

Doug Brush and another local farmer will visit camp Sense of Wonder (SoW) accompanied by some of their gentle, friendly animals. We will plant vegetables and herbs in our Organic Garden and expand the Bee, Hummingbird and Butterfly garden. Claire Lefave and Emily Palena, from the Island Grown Schools Farm to School program, will come in to talk to the campers, parents and community and also work in the garden with the children. We will learn about renewable resources, conservation, how plants relate to one another and worms. We will explore creativity this week working in many different mediums, Drawing, Painting, Clay, Sculpture, Music, and Theater projects. Throughout the summer everyone will have the opportunity to work and care for the gardens. We will brainstorm and talk about different fun ways to educate and inspire people to help the Monarch Butterfly flourish again. There will be someone coming in to show us how to make felted animals out of colored wool. We will have a display of locally grown and created food, an art show and a performance at noon on Friday.

Week 2: July 7th: The Arm of the Sea Theater: Puppetry, Masks, Theater and Live Music workshops and performance with an Environmental theme related to Water, the Ocean and Rivers: Patrick Wadden and Marlena Marallo: Teaching Artists & Theater Directors

Mr. Wadden is co-founder and director, with Marlena Marallo, of Arm-of-the-Sea Theater, an award-winning performance ensemble of artists, puppeteers and musicians based in the mid-Hudson Valley of New York State. From the company's beginnings in 1982, he has written and directed all of Arm-of-the-Sea's productions. He also creates the sets and many of the characters for the Theater. In addition to his role as Arm-of-the-Sea's managing director, Mr. Wadden is the company's primary teaching artist. Since 1991 he has conducted over 85 residency projects at schools, community centers, and arts camps. He is a regular teaching artist for the Bardavon Opera House, SUNY Purchase Performing Arts Center, and Dutchess Arts Camp. Wadden & Marallo were artists-in-residence at SUNY Ulster in 2011. Other college residencies include University of Dayton, Rochester Institute of Technology, Vassar College and SUNY Brockport. Mr. Wadden's theater projects have been awarded grant support from numerous sources including the National Endowment for the Arts, The NY State Council on the Arts, Jim Henson Foundation,

Robert Rauschenberg Foundation, Nathan Cummings Foundation, Puffin Foundation, Ruth Mott Fund and the Hudson River Foundation. Arm-of-the-Sea has received commissions from Lincoln Center Out of Doors Festival, Environmental Grantmakers Association, Museum of Jewish Heritage, Partners of the Americas and the Hudson River Sloop Clearwater. <http://www.armofthesea.org>

They will explore and discover the essence, heart, core and inherent qualities of something from the natural world in their choice of Drawing, Painting, Music, Theater, Dance, Sculpture, Poetry or Creative Writing and how they interpret it and express it in their own way. They will get to look deeply into the creative process to understand and express it more profoundly. The inspiration for this week comes from Sally Taylor and her ConSenses Project.

Week 4: July 21: Dan Butterworth Puppetry:

The campers will be able to create many different kinds of puppets this week. Dan will bring in an abundance of materials, decorations, paint and glue for the children to fabricate a puppet from their own imagination. They are encouraged to construct their individual unique design, not something from an animated feature or video game. They will also (if they choose) be writing their own puppet shows and creating their own props and scenery. We will continue to work in our organic garden and explore the ocean and its creatures during our beach and swim time. On Friday at noon we will have a Puppet Show Festival for the public. Dan Butterworth will be doing a short demonstration and performance of his hand carved wooden and Shadow Puppets. Please note, there is a \$40 extra charge this week to help pay for the special visiting artist and materials.

Week 5: July 28th: African Creative Arts, Music and Culture, Civil Rights (other Cultures too): Creative Artist and sculptor Bobby Brown and artist and dancer Joan Green will be coming in this week with lots of fun materials to do workshops in Creative Arts, Mask Making, Sculpture, Clay, Drum making and Dance (by choice). We will be focusing on Africa, but will also look into other cultures. Week 6: August 4th: Workshops in Circus Arts, Science and Movement with Marvelous Marvin Novogrodski: Cindy Kallet, the well known singer songwriter and musician, and friends, Grey Larsen, Ellen Epstein and Michael Cicone will be visiting SoW on Monday August 4th to do a music workshop with the campers. They are bringing guitars, concertina, harmonium, Irish flutes, whistles and fiddle: The workshops will include Singing, Songwriting, Dancing and Instruments. Then join Marvelous Marvin, solo performing artist, educator and dancer with the Everett Dance Theatre in Providence RI, as we blend Art, Circus, Dance, Theater and Science in this unique residency. Using exercises in which students will create their own choreography (if they choose) Marvin will guide participants to recognize the ease it takes to create their own works of movement and visual arts. We will create art, build pieces, explore circus arts, layer in theater and toss in some science that will capture your imagination and inspire you to perform. Juggling lessons will be taught, choreography will be designed and fun will be had. On Friday, parents will get a chance to see the exercises in action, enjoy completed projects, get a taste of Marvin's work and even get their hands on some circus arts equipment. There will be an art show and performance on Friday at noon. And on Saturday, Marvin will be performing at The YARD in Chilmark as part of their Saturday morning family matinee series. Week 7: August 11th: Creative Arts from Different Cultures, Peace, Non-Violence, Music, Singing and Songwriting: The Beehive Collective with Molly Shea <http://beehivecollective.org/en/> *The Beehive Design Collective is a wildly motivated, all-volunteer, activist arts collective dedicated to “cross-pollinating the grassroots” by creating collaborative, anti-copyright images for use as educational and organizing tools. We work as word-to-image translators of complex global stories, shared with us through conversations with affected communities.* We will focus on Creative Arts, Animals and Music from different Cultures and Peace Among Nations and Individuals. Gus Ben David will visit us with some of his wild and interesting animals from around the globe. Also Rick Bausman is coming in with his collection of instruments from diverse cultures. The campers will get to create three-dimensional creatures out of clay, papier mache', plaster gauze and other materials. We will create an installation with a mural and the creatures and other sculptures created by the campers. We will do a workshop and a tribute to Peter Seeger, his music and beautiful qualities. There will be an art show, performance and speakers on Friday TBA at noon and a last day of summer camp party. We hope that campers and counselors from this and past summers will join us.

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
